Part – B

Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the college.

The college aims at providing quality and value based education. Effective teaching and academic excellence are the unique and exclusive features of our institution. The college motto *“Do Your Job Well”* also highlights its mission.

1. Academic Activities

- Our mission is to provide quality education and promote excellence of performance.
- The college has adopted an inbuilt mechanism for internal quality check at academic levels. For this, the college Academic Council functions actively.
- To monitor Academic performance the principal holds regular meetings with various Heads of the departments to discuss various matters relating to teaching methods and students performance etc.
- The college prepares Academic Calendar for each session in accordance with the schedule given by the University.
- Merit holders are honoured in the Annual Felicitation Function held in the beginning of each session. In the academic session 2007-08 115 students were placed in the Merit list.
- To promote academic excellence, students are encouraged to take part in Quiz Competitions, Debate, Group Discussions and Seminars etc.

2. Research Activities

- Although teaching is the thrust area of the college, research is being done by individual teachers on part-time basis. The college makes adjustments in timetable to enable teachers to devote more time to research. The teachers are also given study leave as per rules.
- Although research as such is not the academic curricula, some departments do encourage students to learn the rudiments of research. Students of B.Com. (Prof.), Office Management & Secretarial Practices undertake summer training of 6-8 weeks in different organizations and prepare reports every year. Students of P.G.D.C.A. and B.C.A. II take up short projects which they can complete in about a month. Students of B.C.A. III take up major projects of 300 marks. This helps the students to develop research aptitude and improves their analytical skills.

3. Extension Activities

The College is aware of the fact that extension activities are essential for all around development of the personality of the students. Extension activities of all kind-academic, cultural and community oriented are organized. Students are given extra facilities and incentives in the form of medals, prizes, scholarship and liberal concession to motivate them to participate in extension activities organized by college youth club, NSS, NCC and Central Association. Activities are arranged in association with NGO's like Lions club, Rotary club, Manav Sehyog, Punjab Kesari and other social organizations to give scholarships, books and monetary assistance to the meritorious and other needy students, and to hold programmes aimed at creating social and environmental awareness. Our students also assist the GO's in various activities like Pulse Polio Drive, Traffic rules awareness etc.

5. Examination Reforms Implemented :

PCM S.D College for Women, Jalandhar has earned credibility of generations of students for being an institute of intense learning and academic excellence. Every year a number of positions among first ten positions of University Merit List in each class have been secured by students of our College. College has developed its Internal System of Teaching, Learning and Evaluation based on following points.

- First Term in the Academic Session in a College comprises of around 3 months and is the biggest Term. First Terminal Examination a detailed Periodic Test of 3 hours duration in each Subject along with Practical Examination & Viva Voce is conducted in late September to evaluate the performance of students. Students get a chance to revise the syllabus covered in the entire term and get written practice.

Results and Shortage of Lectures of students are sent to Parents/ Guardians so that they remain in touch with the performance of their wards.

- On the basis of performance of this Periodic Test, Lecturers make Categories of students as Top, Average and Below Average students. Principal convenes meeting of various Departments and discusses results. Co-ordination is made between Departments to improve performance of a student lagging behind in one or two subjects. This improves their overall performance in the next Examination. Toppers are encouraged to work still harder and average students are inspired to prepare thoroughly.

- A second Examination based on the pattern of University Examination is conducted in December. All Theory Examinations with separate Papers A,B,C (as required), Practical Examinations, Viva Voce, Project Work is conducted. Result and Shortage of Lectures of students are sent to Parents/Guardians.
- Parent Teacher Meeting is organized in whatever cases it is necessary & suitable measures are adopted. Categories of students earlier made are reviewed after Terminal Examination. It has been generally seen that many students from lower category cross over to a higher category and this is how the overall result of College improves.
- Below Average students based on First Terminal Examination Detailed Periodic Test and second Terminal Examination are given special attention to improve their learning skills. Special Periodic Test for weak students is conducted in February to help them prepare for Annual Examination.
- Students are supplemented with other methods of learning and evaluation. Monitoring in classes is done through oral & written Periodic Class Tests, Home Assignments, Project Works.
- Each Department has a subject Society. Every Department and its Society supplements its method of Teaching and Evaluation through innovative methods such as 'Seminars', Quiz Tests, Group Discussions, Educational Trips, various Competitions based on Topics of syllabi and general relevant current topics (such as Ad Campaigns, Computer/ Chart Presentation/ Model Presentations etc). Prizes are given to top performer. Departments & their Societies also conduct various Seminars, Guest Lectures, Conferences and Workshops both at College Level and National Level. This gives students a larger perspective of their subject and broadens their outlook.
