3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

- (a) Seminars, Conferences, Guest Lectures, Group Discussions, Essay writing competitions, Paper presentations, contests, ad-campaign, Industrial trainings are being organized by various departments to provide exhaustive knowledge to the students and to make them familiar with the latest developments in various fields.
- (b) Different modern teaching methods are used to deliver efficient learning by the teaching faculty. They frequently use Audio-Visual equipments, computer aided techniques, internet applications to work on the browsers and various search engines. Two smart classrooms have been set up in the Department of Commerce and Department of Computer Science and IT. Students are trained to work in challenging environment where everyone requires instant information.

5. Examinations reforms implemented

PCM S.D. College for Women is known for its excellent results and achieving distinctions in university results. Our students have always won top positions and a large number of merit positions in university examination every year. A wellframed Internal System of teaching higher

learning and evaluation is adopted. Constructive steps are being taken to modify the examination system after evaluating the achievements and performance in the preceding years.

- The examination committee of college conducts two terminal examinations in the month of September and December respectively to evaluate the performance of the students. Previously there used to be two sessions viz, Morning and Evening in each Terminal Examination, but from this year, the examinations are being conducted in single session to avoid the wastage of time and resources. The surplus time available is utilized by members of faculty to perform the duties assigned to them for preparation of various items for Zonal and Inter Zonal Youth Festival organized by GNDU Amritsar.
- Syllabi as per the guidelines by the University is completed and implemented in various subjects. The examination are conducted according to the pattern prescribed by the university.
- First Terminal Examination a detailed test of 3 hours duration in each subject along with practical examination and viva voce is conducted in late September to provide an opportunity to the students for revision of the syllabus covered in the entire term and get the written practice.
- A Second Examination is conducted in the month of December. All theory examinations with separate papers A,B,C (as required), Practical Examinations, Viva Voce, Project work are conducted.
- Academic standing of the students is monitored and assessed through these examinations. Top, Average and below average students are categorized on the basis of their performance by the teachers. Results are discussed in the meetings of various departments convened by the Principal. Special attention, extra coaching and guidance is given to top students. They are encouraged and motivated to read extra books and journals to know the latest developments. Similarly weak students are identified and they frequently discuss their difficulties and problems with their teachers. Teachers keep full track of such students. This improves their overall performance in examinations. Special periodic test for weak students is conducted in February to help them for preparing for Annual Examinations.
- Parents/Guardians are given intimation about the results and shortage of lectures of their wards. Parent teacher meeting is organized in whatever cases it is necessary and suitable measures are adopted for improvement of performance of students.
- The collective and strenuous efforts made by the Principal and members of faculty result in improvement of learning skills of the students. It enables them to perform better in annual examinations and to bring laurels for their institute.

18. Community services

College NSS & NCC Units, Red Cross Society and some other societies make concerted efforts to bring in orientation in their activities. Social, ecological and economic issues are of great concern to them. Positive role modelling is provided by these units to encourage community service and create responsible citizens.

- A safe and healthy environment is the right of every human being and it is also the duty of all human beings to contribute in every possible way to keep the environment eco-friendly. Prakriti- an environmental club started with the mission of 'Go Green' has been working hard to achieve this goal. It is a self financing club which promotes 'Go Green' message with the help of student volunteers.
- Red Cross society remained active throughout the year and following programmes were conducted for the noble cause of community services.
- (a) The 8th of September was proclaimed **International Literacy Day** by UNESCO on November 17, 1965. It was first celebrated in 1966. Its aim is to highlight the importance of literacy to individuals, communities and societies. On International Literacy Day this year, the college Red Cross Society held a discussion to acquaint the students with the status of literacy and adult learning. The single most important thing that can be done to improve the world is perhaps this- educate girls.
- (b) World Peace Day, dedicated to peace and absence of war was celebrated on the 21st of September, 2010. Waving their caps in the air the Red Cross unit volunteers shouted the slogan "Long live absolute world peace".
- (C) Human Rights Day is celebrated annually across the world on 10 December. Awareness is the best step forward in checking human rights' violation. This was the view of the student speakers at a workshop on human rights on December 10th 2010. The workshop, a celebration of human rights, focused on how education coupled with awareness of one's rights could bring in results. College students formed groups to discuss human rights issues and suggested solutions. Many topics were raised like: in-custody police torture and women not being allowed to choose their partner for marriage.
- NSS units of the college organized a lecture on 'Drug Abuse' on 28.12.11 Prof. Lakhbir Singh, President Pehal an NGO delivered a motivating lecture suggesting ways and means to remove this bane from the society.
- 'Not Me, But You' working under this banner, NSS units organized a seven day camp from 24th Dec. 2011 to 30th Dec. 2011. The volunteers participated in various community outreach programmes.
- A lecture on 'Nature Therapy' was organized at village Gakhlan on 29th Dec, 2010. Dr. Kaushal, the speaker advised the villagers to avoid unnecessary use of medicines to cure

- diseases. He advocated yoga exercises, meditation, drinking water frequently and taking a healthy diet.
- A Blood donation camp was organized jointly by NSS and Red Cross units of the college on 9th Sep., 2010in collaboration with Red Cross society and Civil Hospital, Jalandhar. 51 students donated blood for the noble cause.
- NSS units participated in AID Awareness Rally on 1st Dec. 2010.

26. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates.

Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and other activities is our priority and efforts are being made regularly in this direction.

- (a) Financial matters at administrative level are totally computerized such as preparation of salary bills for each month, monthly schedules and different financial statements. Annual accounts, preparation of different returns for Income Tax and P.F are also computerized.
- (b) Faculty matters such as preparation of various proceedings, memos, updating the establishment details of faculty and other supporting staff, maintaining records in order of retired staff members and so on, is also computerized.
- (c) Optimum usage of computers like using email facility and internet for the benefit of Administration, assisting in various extension activities of different department in college, various works of scholarships, financial assistance to students, educational concession to eligible students etc. is a regular practice.
- (d) All the academic matters like students biodata, assistance for internal assessments in departments taking printout of lecture notes for faculty, assisting faculty in discharging their various academic work etc, also includes best usage of Computers, Printers, Scanners, Internet facility etc.
- (e) Most of the departments make use of LCD projectors for powerpoint presentation in the classes specially P.G. Department of Commerce, Computer Science & I.T and Fashion Designing.
- (f) The college has its own e-mail ID for timeless and convenient communication with the students as well as staff members. Almost all the department of the college have their own email-IDs.
- (g) 2 smart class rooms were provided to P.G. Department of Computer Science & I.T and P.G Department of Commerce which are equipped with various facilities like Interactive boards, Projectors, PC's (DELL), Mimiopad, Interactive Panels, Visualizers etc. This has added a lot of confidence among the students.
- (h) The departments especially P.G. Department of Commerce, P.G. Department of Computer Science & I.T and others are active in the development of ICT packages for use in class room teaching. Powerpoint presentation is a regular feature in the class room teaching. Inter class seminars of various classes have also been organised using ICT skill to motivate students and enhance their knowledge.
- (i) College has SMS application from this session through which any kind of message or information can be circulated among all teaching as well as non teaching staff members, students and parents. This helps to convert campus into paperless based administration.
- (j) College website which was static has been converted into dynamic website during this session. Any kind of message or information could be easily circulated among the staff members or alumni or parents or students by sending message in group to their email ids. Due to increasing demand of internet access by the teaching as well as non teaching staff and student, speed of internet leased line connection has been doubled during this session i.e. from 1 mbps to 2 mbps.
